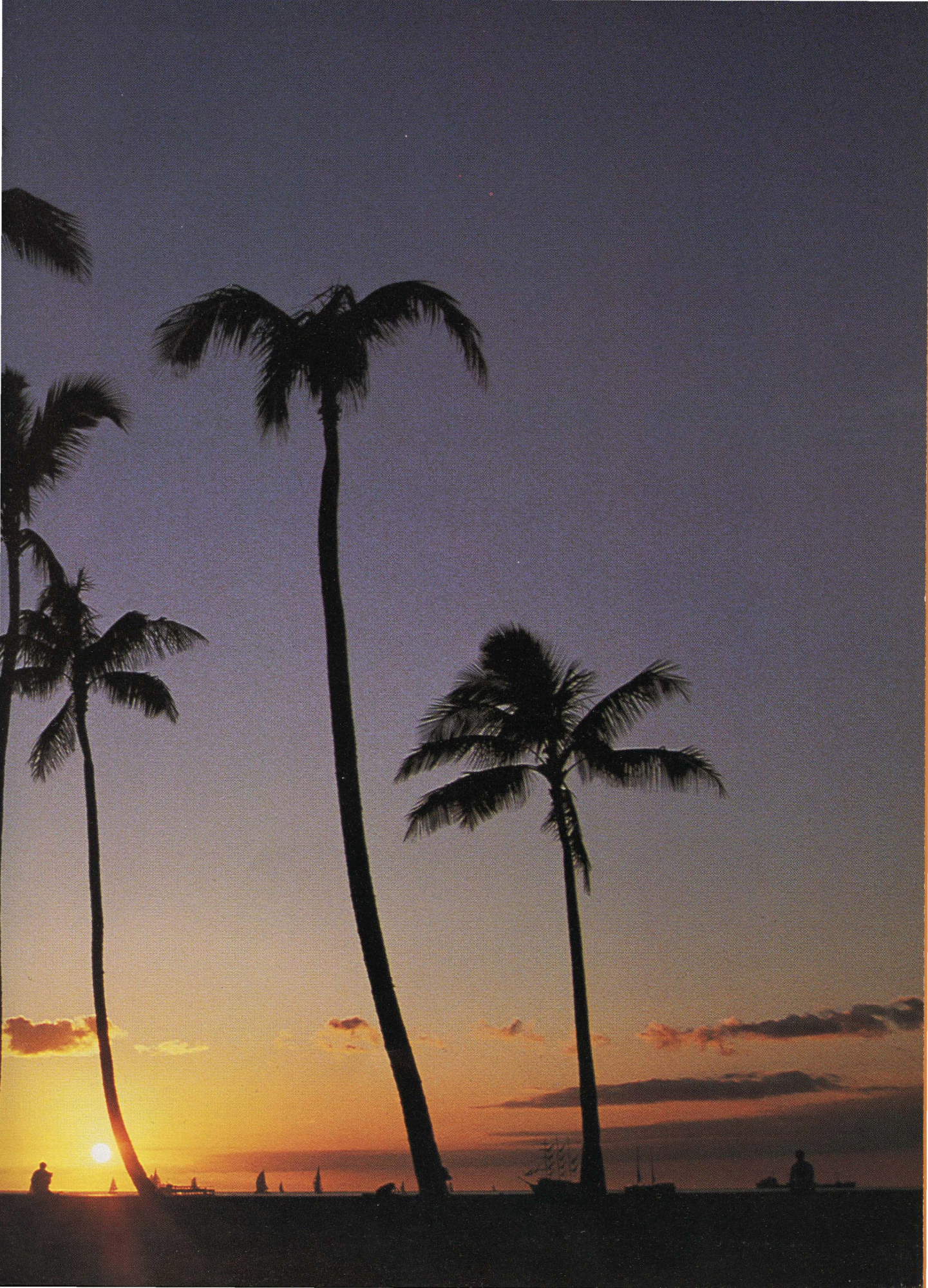


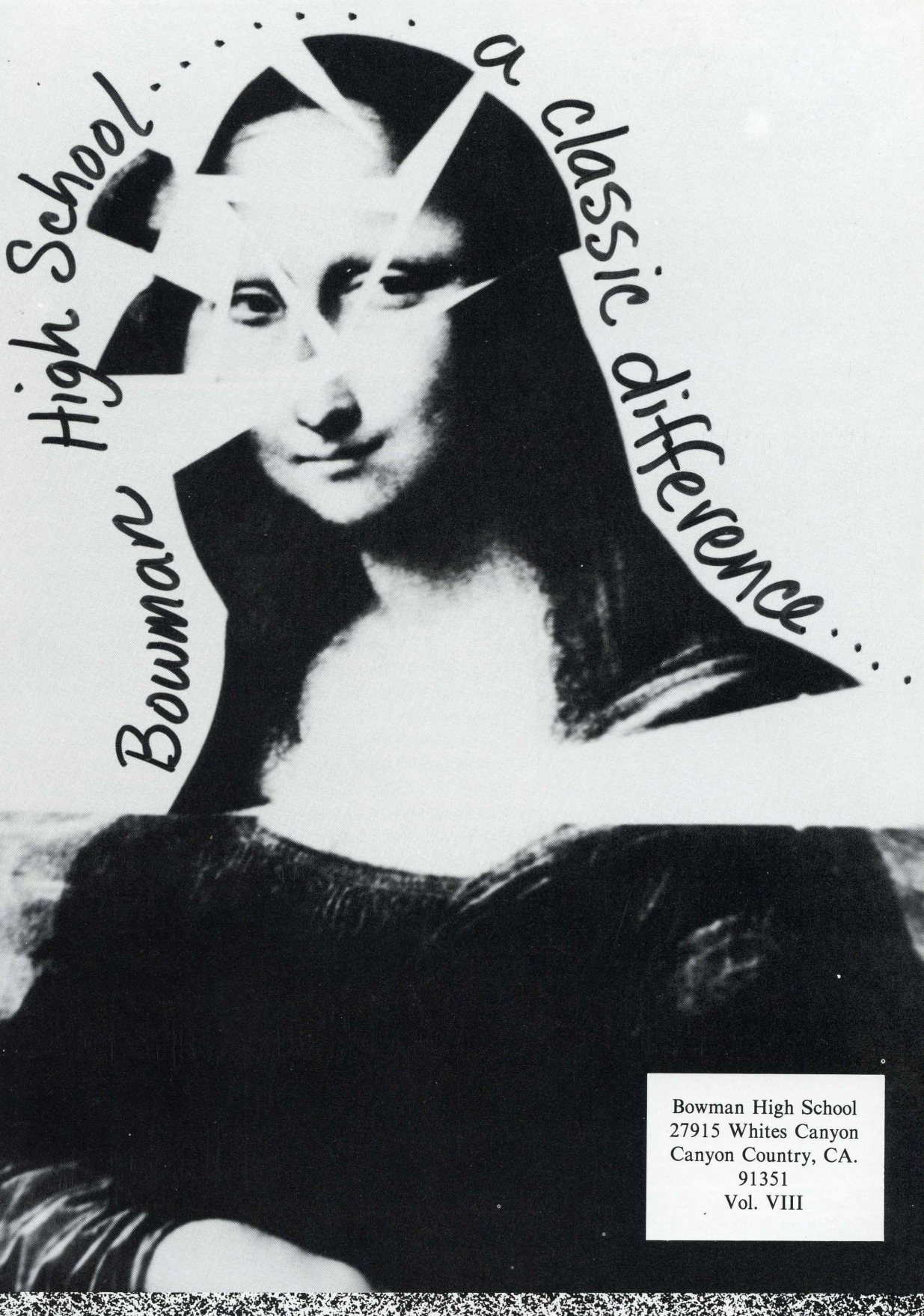

Jeremy Chinizi - 17

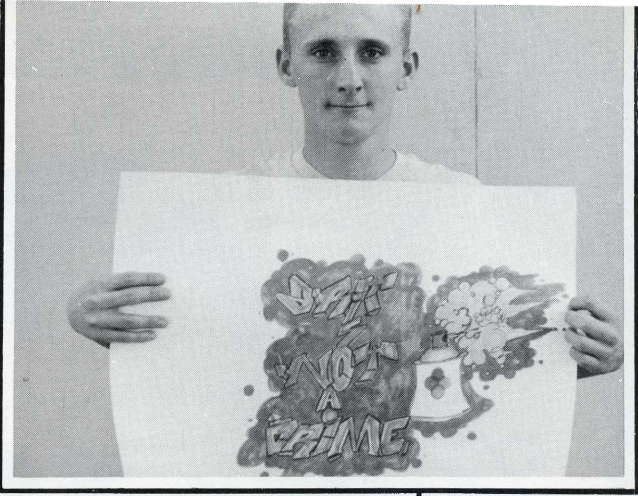

Learning how to play music was the best thing that ever happened to me because I can express myself without words.



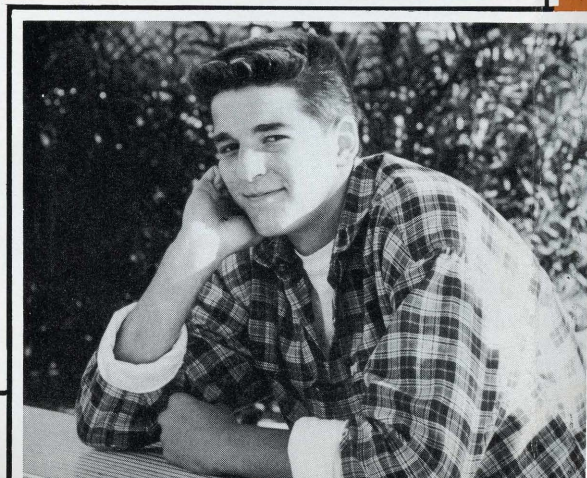
Jason Seminario - 17

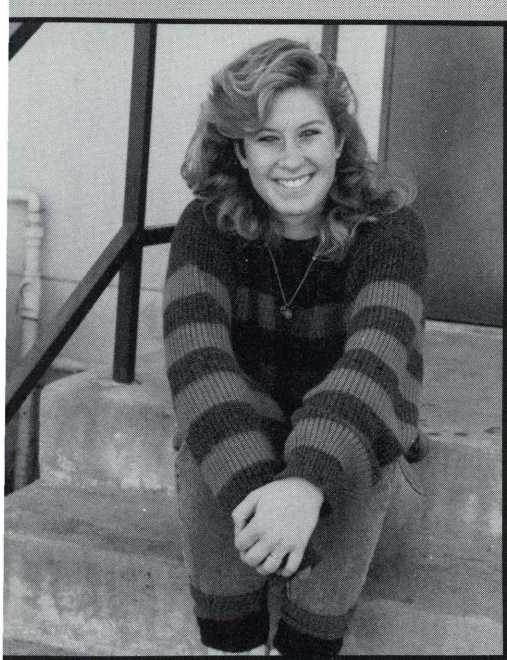

I'd like to go to a junior college when I graduate from Bowman. I am interested in Hypnotherapy.

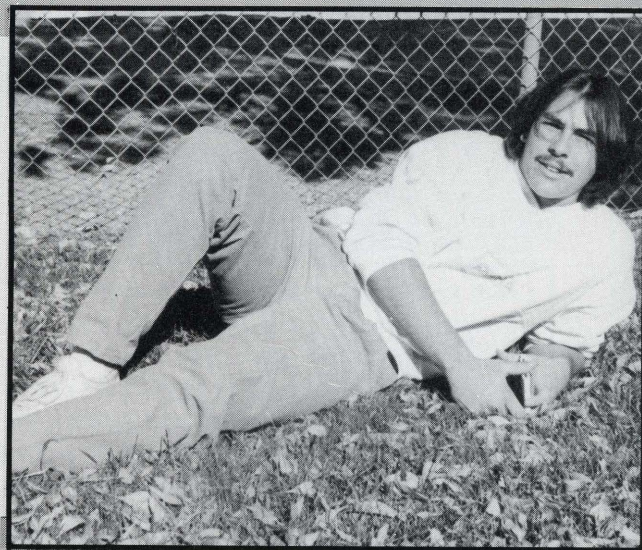
Although I guess I'd describe myself as a laid back person, I think I can accomplish most all of my goals when I put my mind to it.

Melissa Blalock - 17

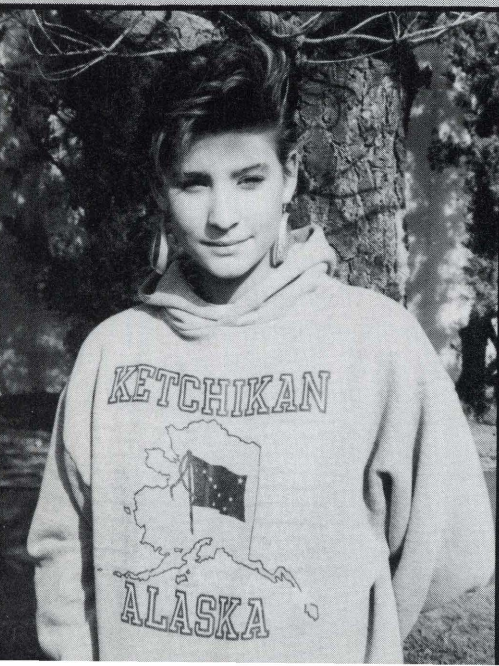

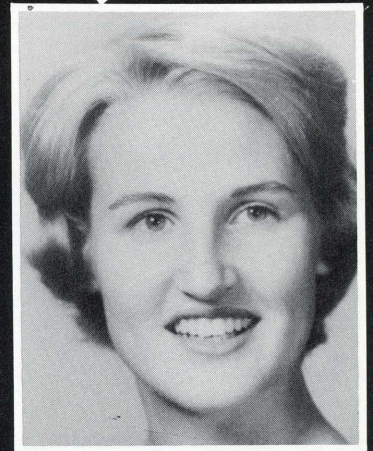
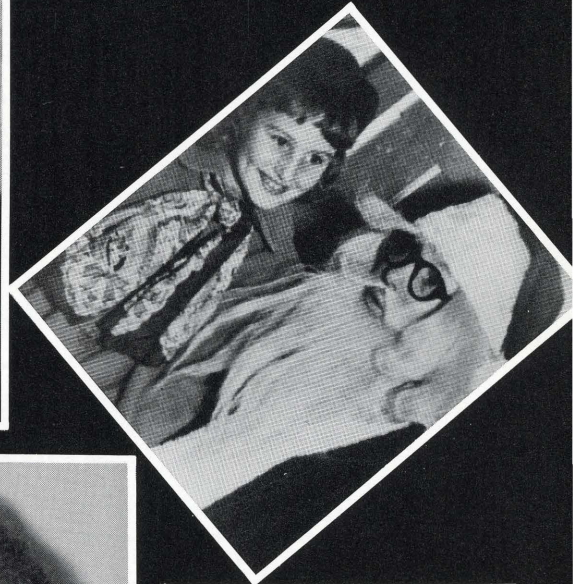
When I graduate from Bowman I want to go to C.O.C. and then to U.C.S.B.

The best thing that ever happened to me is my move from Oxnard to Canyon Country.

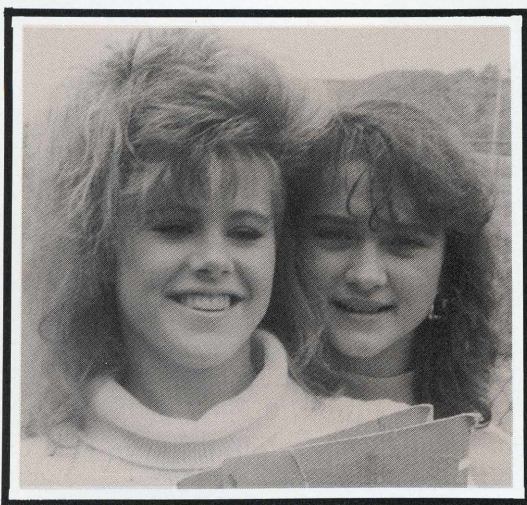

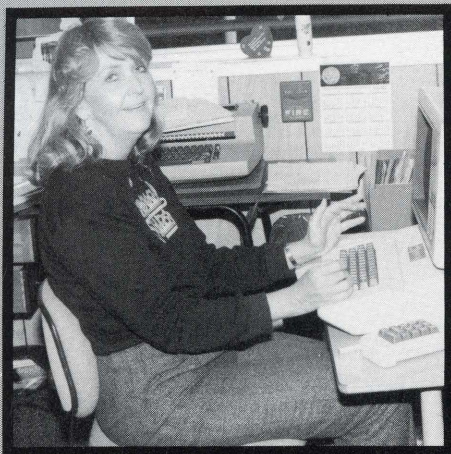


Frolicking Freaks

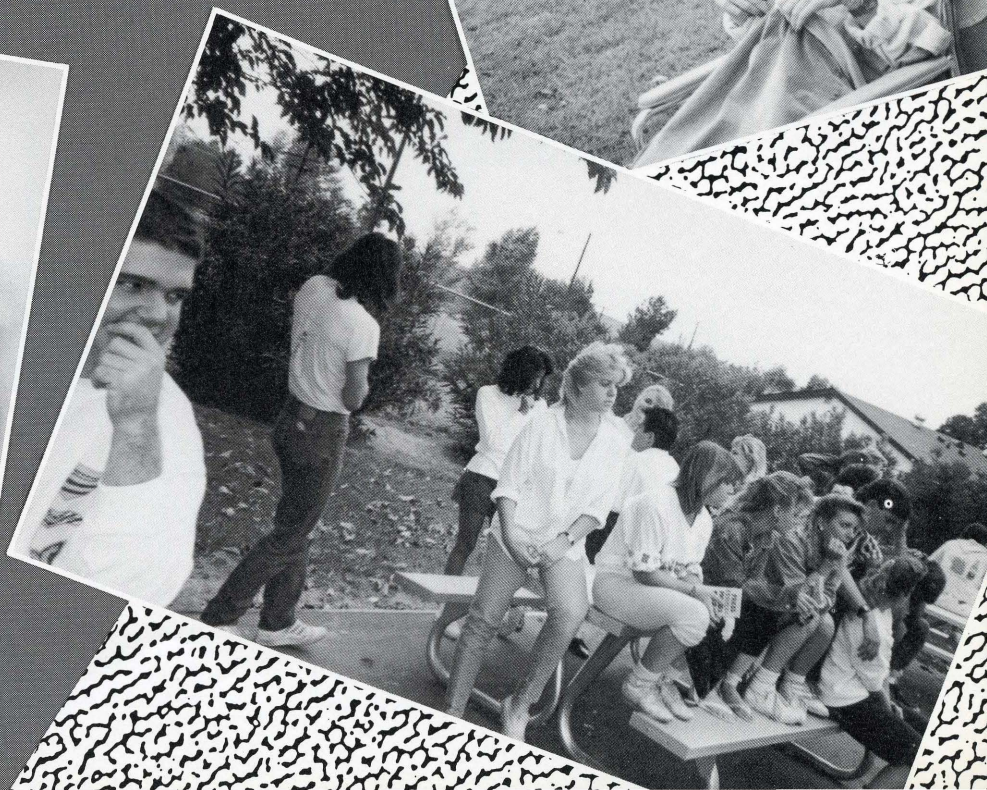
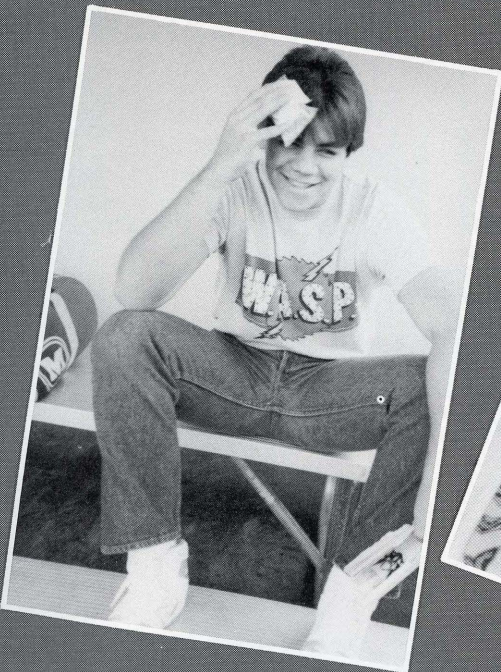
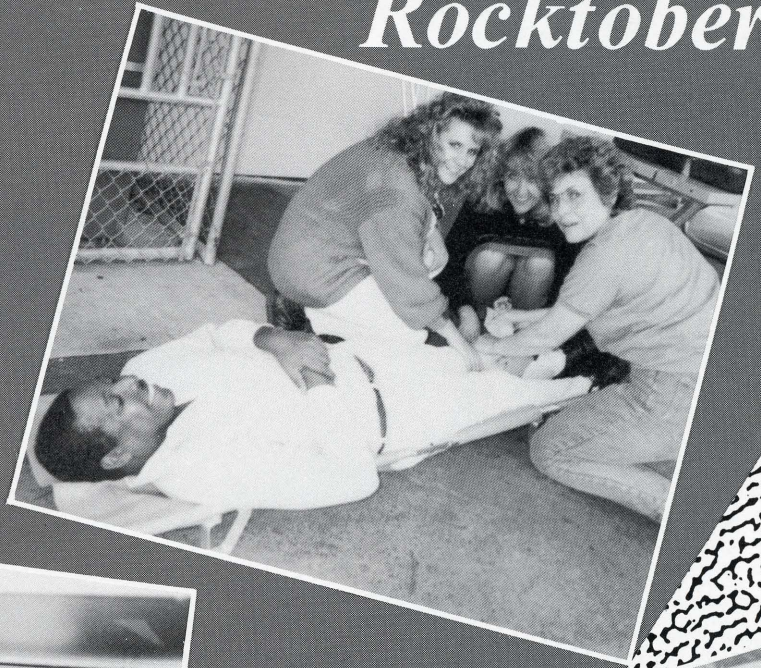
Can You Believe it?

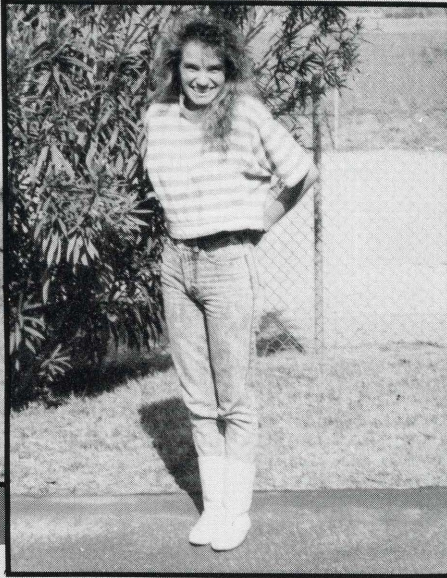
Rocktober

Students must attend one class meeting per week and furnish pay stub verification for credit.

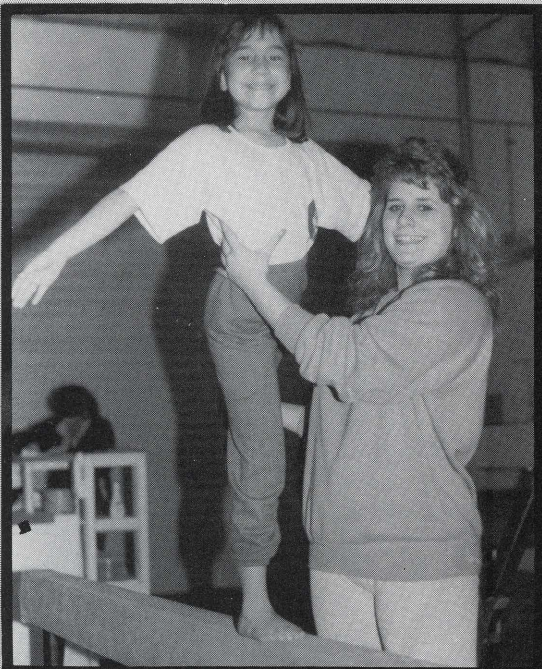
