Cross Country action shows Harold Ledbetter and Steve Heri finishing the two mile course. The team had a good year with a season record of 6 wins and 3 losses.













Something wonderful happened at Hart this past year in football. What happened? Some uninformed people may ask. This past year the Indians turned in one of the best seasons in recent years with a five win three loss record and a tie for second place in the Frontier League.

There were many disappointments during the season such as the 7-7 tie with Santa Paula that kept the team from CIF. But there were many high spots to out-weigh the disappointments. High spots such as the 21-7 defeat of Buena at homecoming and the defeat of Palmdale at the beginning of the season.

INDIVIDUAL LEADERS

Number one ground gainer for the Indians was senior Bob Englestad with a 7.5 yard per carry average.

Junior quarterback, Alva Bridges, led the Indians in scoring with six T.D.'s and three PATs for 39 points. Bridges also led in passing completing 18 of 40 passes for 244 yards.

There were also many other fine individual efforts by Juniors. Julio Garcia and Ken Barnett helped the team tremendously.

Seniors Marvin Buenning and Ron Watts also turned in fine performances this past year. Before his injury Gary Guise did very well with 3.41 yards per carry average.


It's a long way from Buenos Aires to Hart High but Ed Calero made it. The AFS Exchange Student spent the year with the Bill Bonelli family in Saugus.

The Tomahawk has produced a yearbook covering the activities of the 1964-65 school year. We have made an effort to portray as many of the events as possible.


