
















So far in the season the Jay Vees have put on only mediocre performance, but the team has many good individual players, and will probably start to win when the team becomes unified.

Due to an unsportsmanlike performance by a team member the Junior Varsity team was temporarily disbanded, but after the player had been disciplined the team got back to work.










The Hart High wrestling team started the 1965-1966 season with two returning lettermen from last year's varsity team, and a new assistant coach, Dennis Wendt. The team, consisting mostly of sophomores and juniors, decided early in the season to be an above average one. Through their desire and all-around attitude, many personal and school records were set. The League score for the team of three wins and three losses is a school record. By placing 4th in the Simi Invitational and 3rd in the Inter-Valley League tournament, two more records were set. The Varsity had a 5-7 dual meet record. The Junior Varsity's record of 6-5 was the first winning season that a Hart J. V. wrestling team has had.
