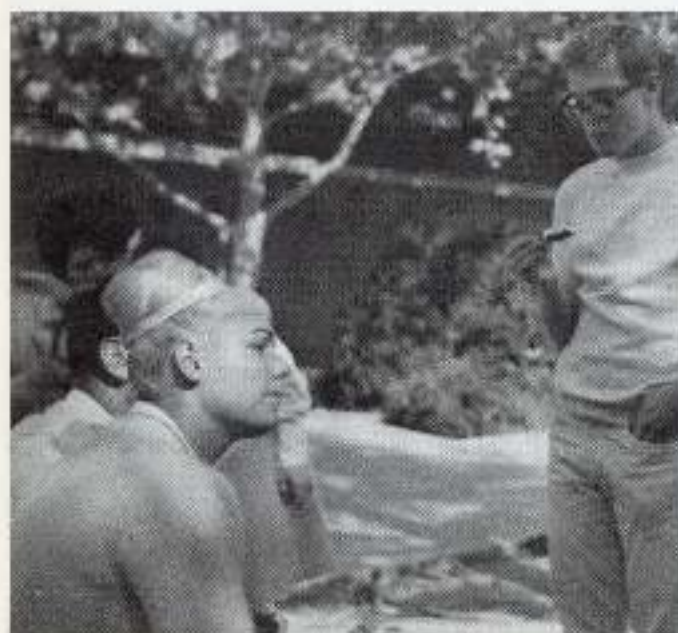

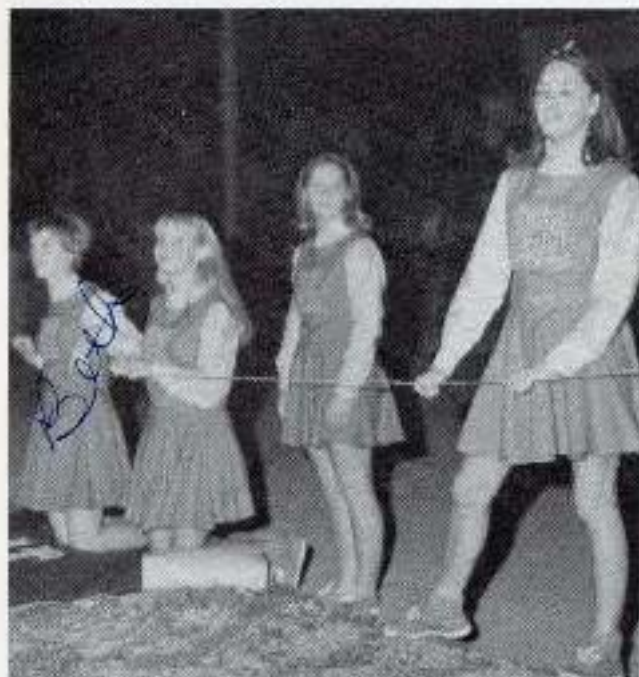

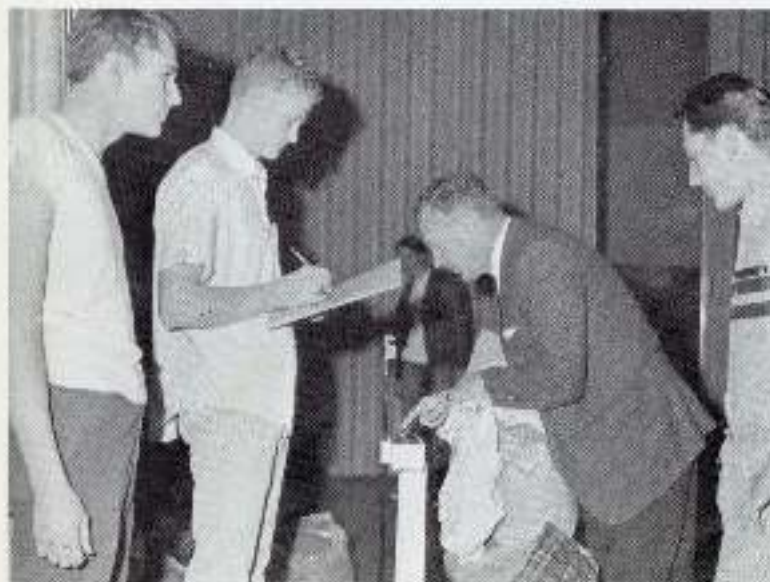

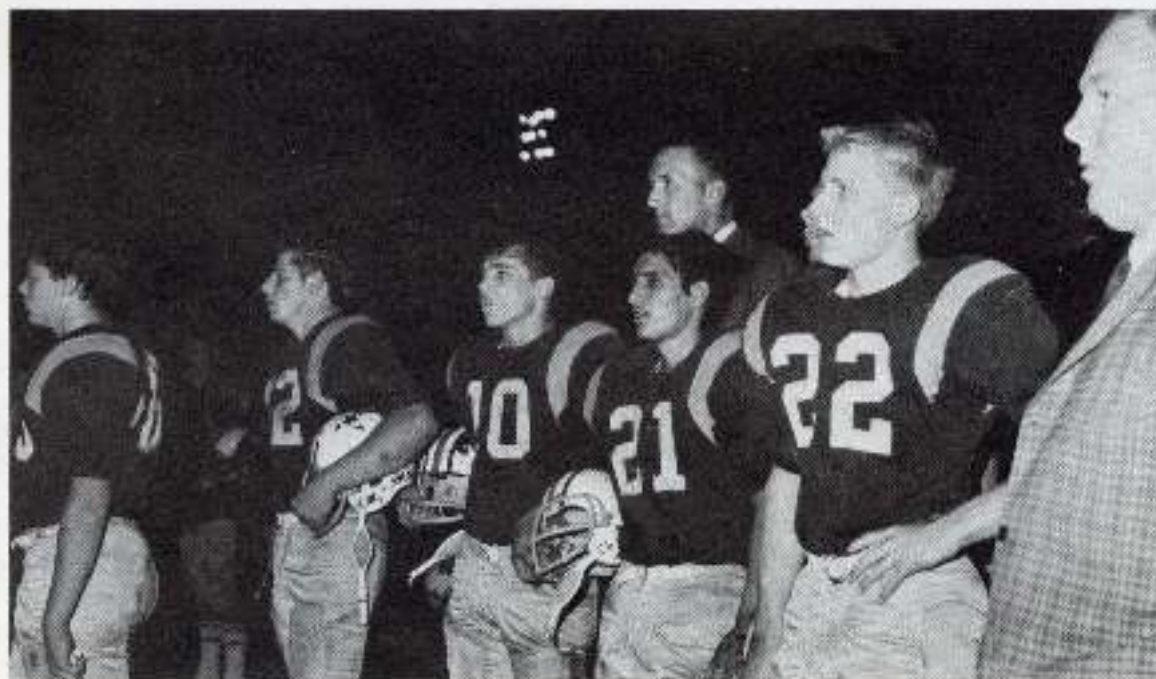

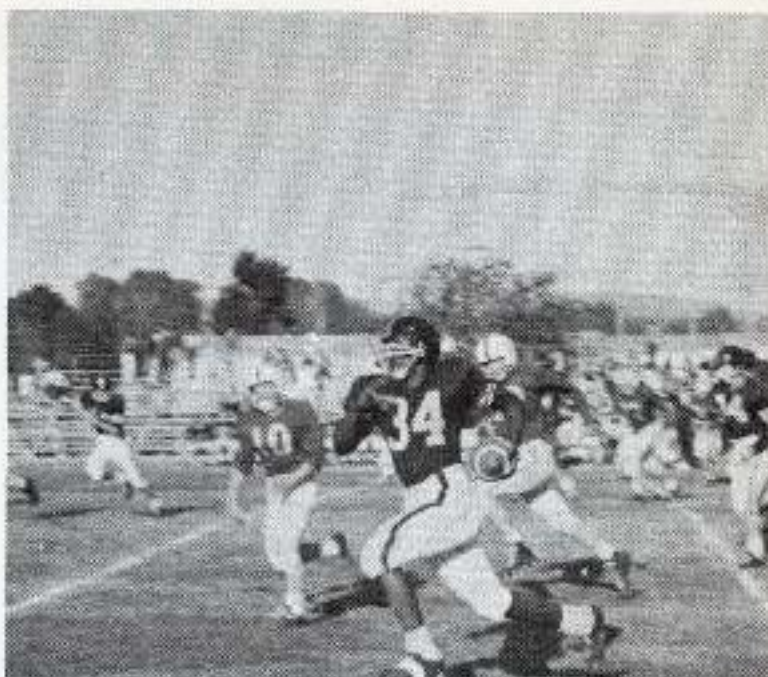

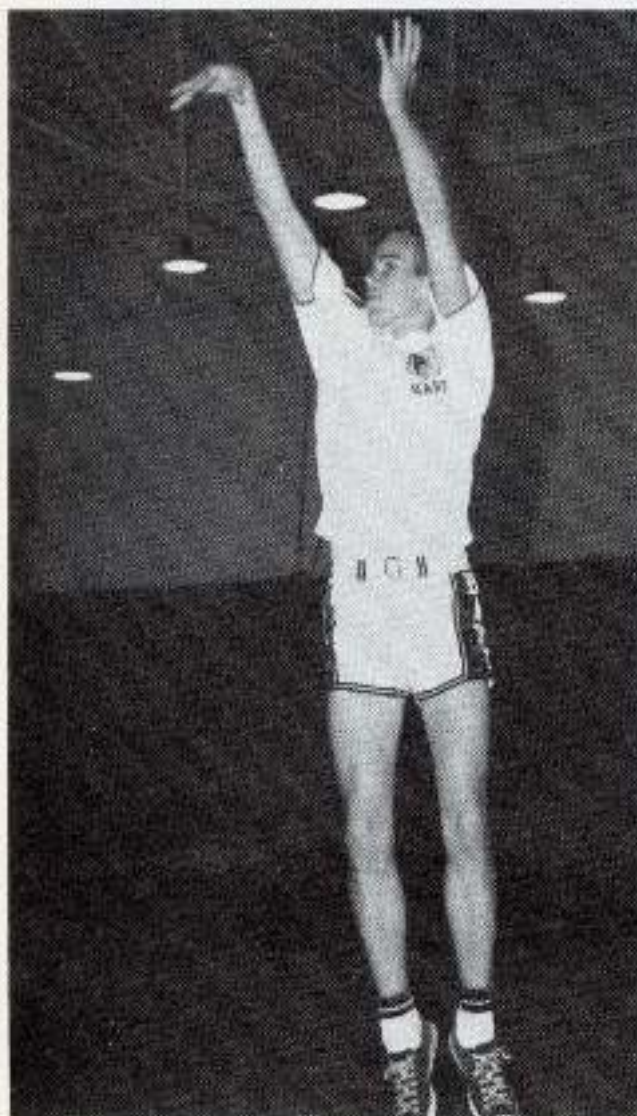

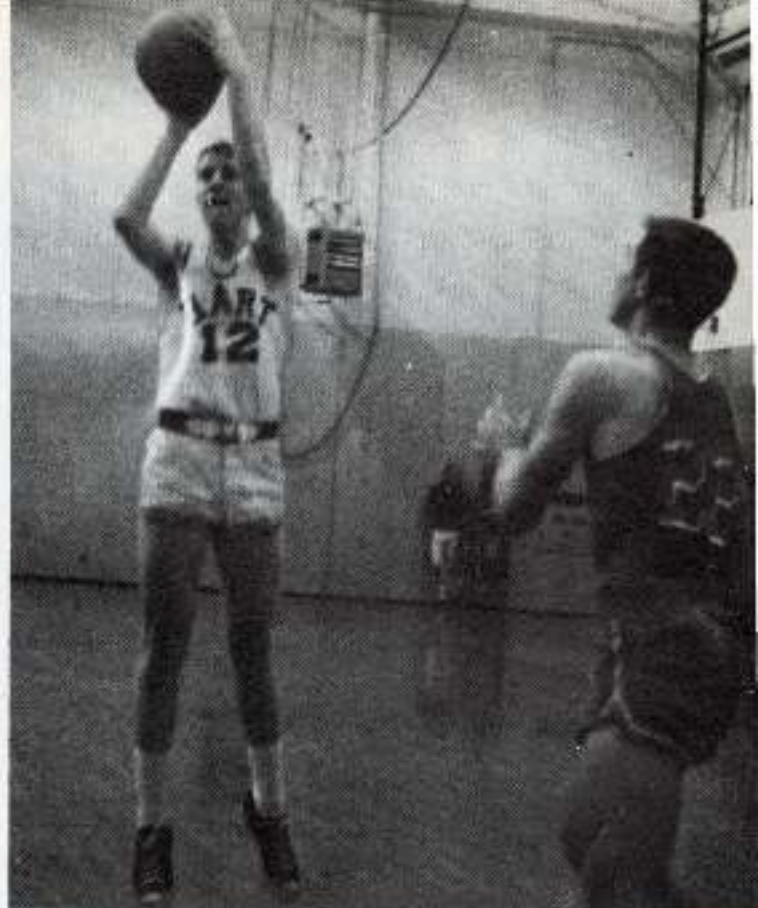

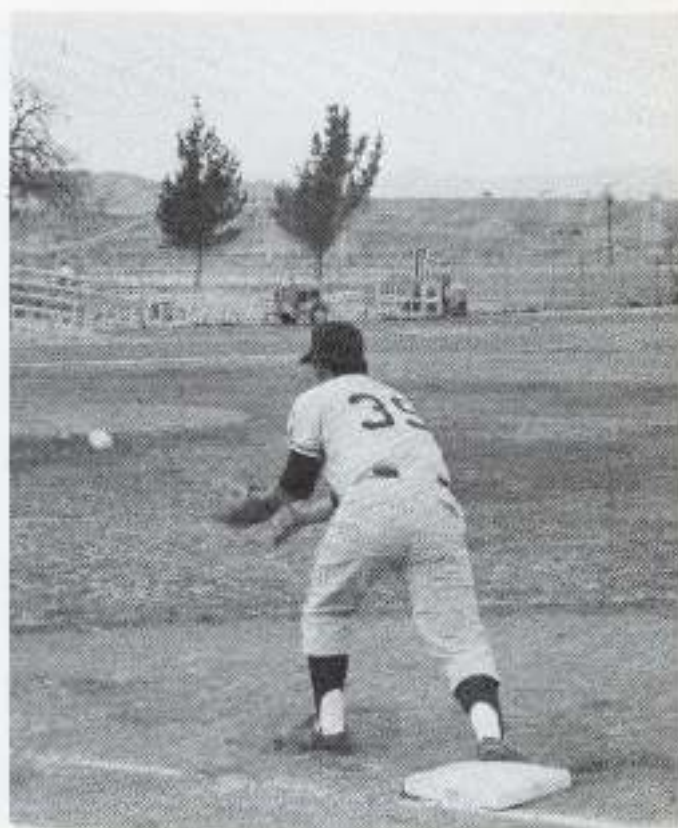

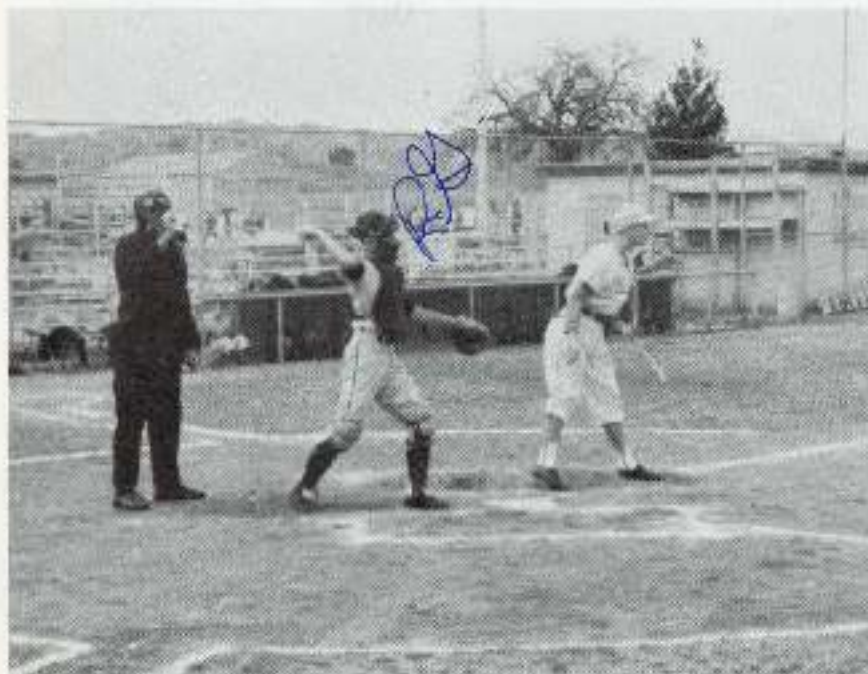

Due to an unsportsmanlike performance by a team member the Junior Varsity team was temporarily disbanded, but after the player had been disciplined the team got back to work.

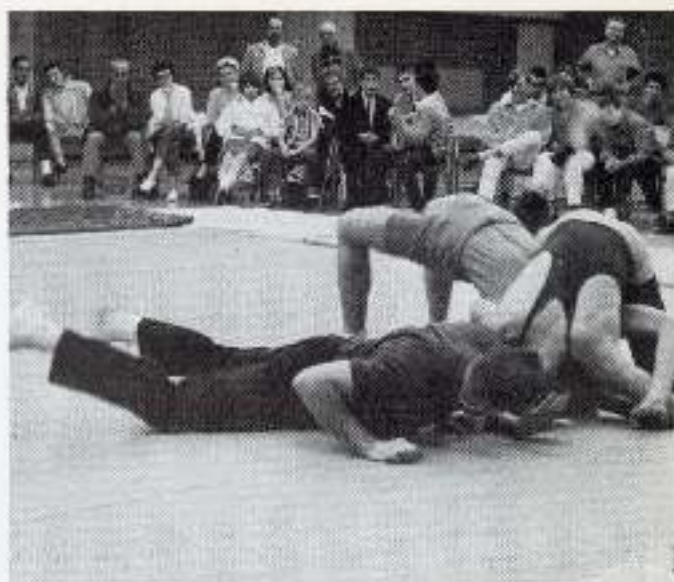

This year's track team is composed chiefly of sophomores and juniors, with a few seniors to back up in some events.

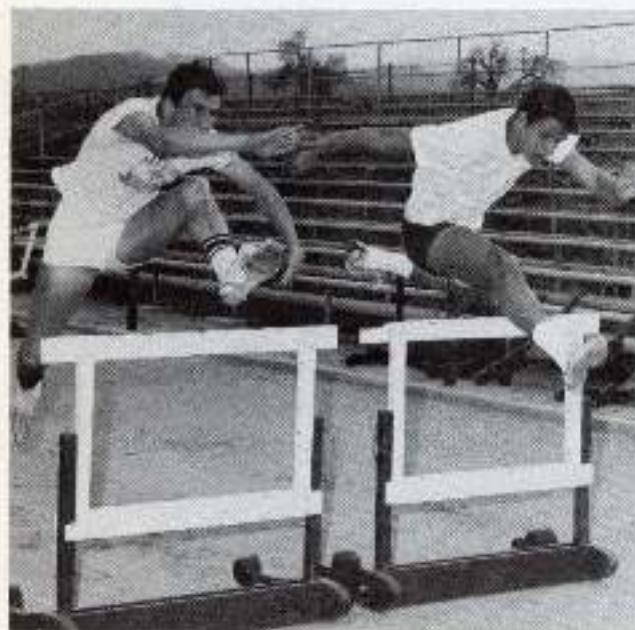
Coach Reisbig strongly believes that this great Hart team can take league honors in the varsity, and place highly in the B's and C's.

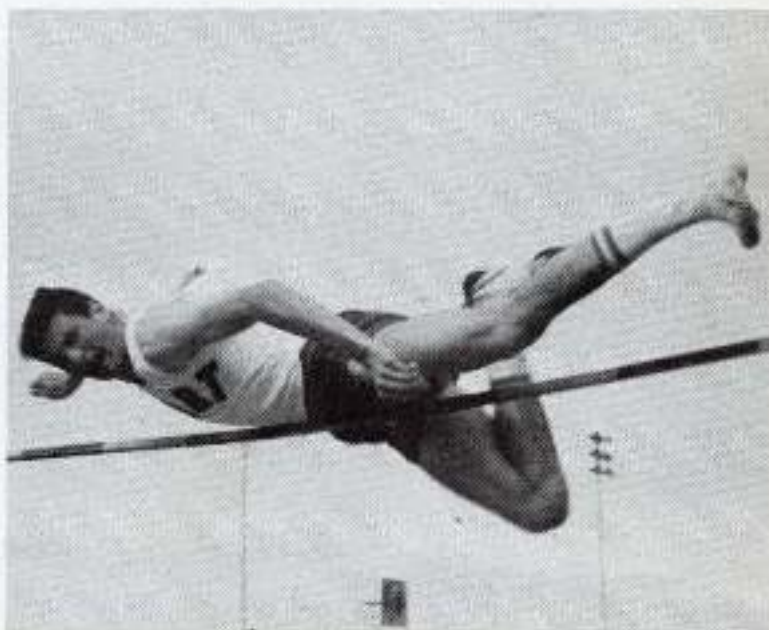
