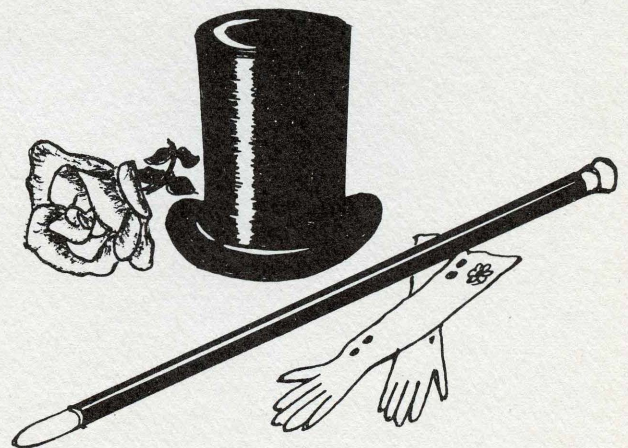

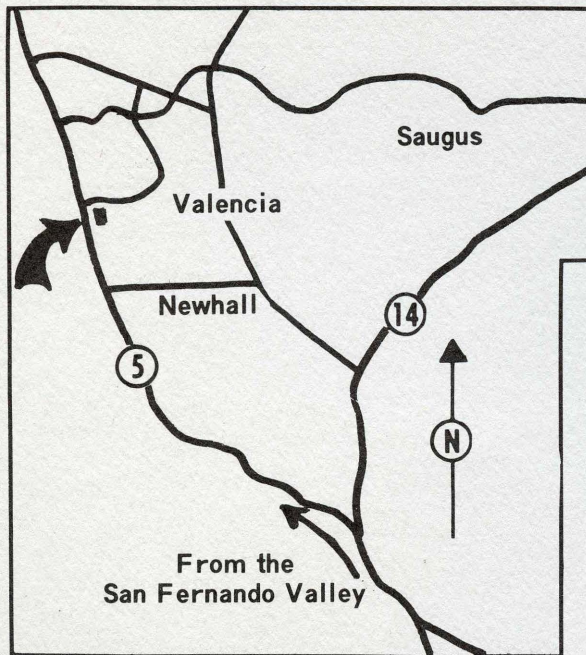

The Boys' Club is deeply indebted to Mr. Holland for his services which he is donating to our cause tonight.



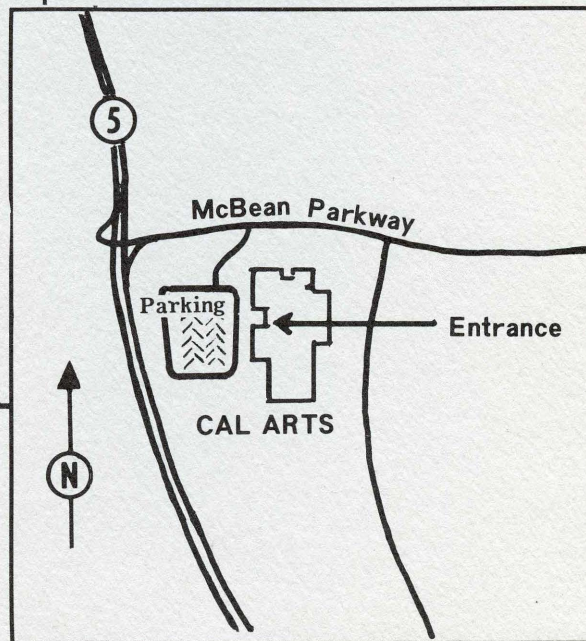

Getting to the Auction



California Institute of the Arts is located at the McBean Parkway exit of the Golden State Freeway (Highway 5) in Valencia.

From Los Angeles, take Highway 5 north into the Santa Clarita Valley and exit at McBean.



Take the first right turn off McBean Parkway and drive up to the Cal Arts parking lot atop the hill.

The main gallery is located just inside the entrance on the west side of the school.

The doors at Cal Arts will open at 7:00 p.m. for cocktails and dancing. The bid boards will be open at 7:00 p.m. and the live auction will begin at 9:00 p.m. This catalogue is your admission ticket. Please bring it with you to the auction.

The Rules of the Auction

LIVE AUCTION RULES

1. The live auction will begin at 9:00 p.m. and will run until approximately 10:30 p.m. It will consist of the verbal auctioning of Items No. 1-32 in the order that they appear in this catalogue.
2. On entering the auction hall, each guest will be issued a bid card with a bid number assigned. This number is required for all bidding and purchasing of items, so please memorize your number and keep your card with you.
3. During the auction, if you wish to bid on an item, wave your pom-pom or bid card as frantically as possible to attract the auctioneer's attention. If you win an item, please announce your bid number to the auctioneer immediately, but keep your seat.
4. A "runner" will bring a sales slip directly to you, indicating the prize you have purchased and the amount of your winning bid. After signing this slip, you are free to proceed to the cash tables to pay for your item and pick up your prize. If you wish, you may wait until the end of the evening and pay for all your purchases at one time at the cash table.
5. The Boys' Club requires that all prizes be paid for in full at the auction. Payment may be made by cash, check, BankAmericard or Master Charge. Payment may be deferred only by special arrangement with Boys' Club Officials, and a deposit shall be required.
6. Unless otherwise specified, all auction items and services must be used within one year from June 14, 1975. All items are transferrable — they may be presented by the winner to another person — pending the approval of the donor.
7. According to the Internal Revenue Service, only the amount paid for an auction prize "in excess of the actual cash value of that prize" is tax deductible. A written receipt indicating such an amount, for tax purposes, will be issued to you after the auction at your request.
8. The Boys' Club guarantees all prizes at the auction. Any bidder whose prize is forfeited through no fault of his own, or who is not completely satisfied that his purchase has met the description and condition specified at the bidding will receive a full refund.

SILENT AUCTION RULES

1. The silent auction will begin at 7:00 p.m. and will consist of written bidding on approximately 150 items posted on bid boards along the walls. The first 8 groups of bid board items are listed in this catalogue. Two additional groups will be listed in the addendum, published just before the auction.
2. Each item can be located according to its group number, and by the color of its group. Bids will be accepted on each item until the board closes. The following are the closing times:

3. All items in the silent auction have bid sheets attached or affixed nearby. Persons desiring to bid must do so by legibly writing their name, bid card number, and amount of the bid on the bid sheet.
4. Each bid sheet notes a minimum value by which the existing bid must be increased in order to constitute a higher valid bid. Each new bid must be written on the topmost blank line available on the bid sheet.
5. The bid boards will be closed approximately at the times stated here in the catalogue. However, the official closing will be that time when the Boys' Club Official actually removes the bid sheet from the board.
6. In the event that bidding is still in progress when the Boys' Club Official attempts to close the board, the Official shall conduct a live auction on the spot allowing all persons present to bid, and shall determine the winning bidder. His decision shall be final.
7. At the time the board is closed, an official shall post the name and number of the winning bidder on the board. Later in the evening, the names of the winning bidders will be announced publicly.
8. All winning bidders are to report to the cashier's table to pay for the items and to claim their prizes. Any bidder not making arrangements for payment at the cashier's table by 12 midnight will forfeit his right to purchase the item and it will be made available to the next highest bidder.

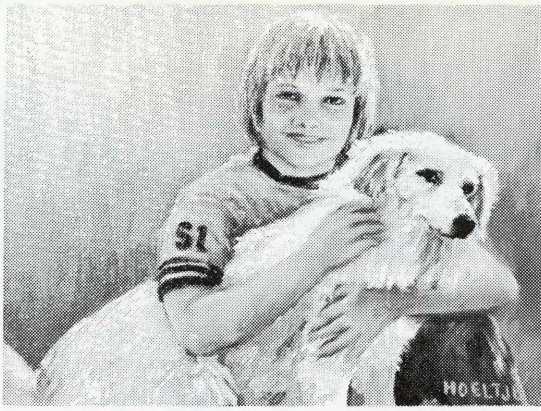

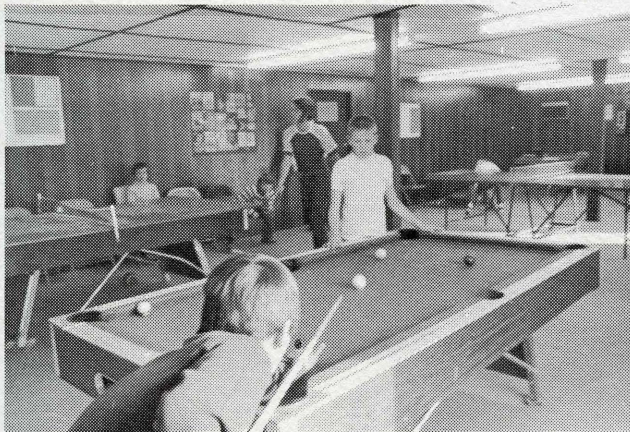
The Santa Clarita Valley Boys' Club is a chartered member of the Boys' Club of America, and is headquartered in Newhall. We provide after-school and weekend recreation and social activities, including arts and crafts, special trips, education and guidance to youngsters from 7-18 in the communities of Newhall, Saugus, Valencia, Castaic and Canyon Country.

At present we maintain a combination administration office — teen center in Newhall and four satellite facilities located at Emblem, Skyblue Mesa, Valley View, and Castaic Schools. During the summer, we conduct additional programs at many other schools.

Our five programs combined now serve a total 250 children throughout the valley each day, five days a week, and our facilities are used by over 1,000 different youngsters during the year.



Our long-term goal is to establish our own private clubhouses in the outlying areas of our valley to avail our services to every child. The pictures on this page show the activities at two of our satellite buildings. Both quarters provide indoor and outdoor recreation to local neighborhood children without interfering with public school programs or facilities. During the coming year, we hope to construct our third satellite clubhouse at Valley View School.
